# The old cabins

About 80 years Scout camp camping was very different. In the 30's and 40's Scouts came to camp as individuals rather than with a troop and often stayed in cabins with counselors. This was a wide spread practice both at Camp Eastman and nationally. Today, out of the 9 original cabins, only 3 remain

"**Mouse Manor**" was so named by camp director Al Lewis due to the excessive amount of mice living there. "Mouse" was originally the medical lodge from the early 40's until the mid 50's.

**Eagles Nest**, pictured below, was used until about 1959. It consisted of three cabins about halfway down a hill with a great Mississippi River overlook.

Not pictured is one of the cabins still standing, "**Cooks 1**" located on the south-east side of staff row.

Mid left is a picture of one of the remaining three cabins, cooks 2, or as it is referred to today "**The Bungalow**". This cabin started its' career as a campers cabin at Oriels Nest, which is now part of the Tribal area next to W.O. Peterson council ring. The Bungalow slept 12 Scouts and leaders: from my personal experience of spending my first two summers in the "Bungalow" and as you might guess, life in the cabins was often a rowdy affair, more about fun than sleep.

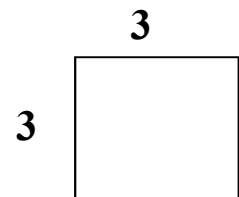
